To get started.....

APPLY - - - On this site within the "Forms" tab we have an application. This needs to be printed, completed, and sent to our office. When we receive the application, we will get you set up in our system. You can also call the office to give information over the phone. This information is confidential and is not released. Please let us know if you would like us to put you on the newsletter prayer list.

REQUEST HELP - -

Travel - - Also within "Forms" there is a travel reimbursement form to be printed. Fill out the top with your street and mailing address. Take to your treatment facility on your next visit. Request they fax to us when completed with dates and signatures by the end of the month.

Utility - - If you need help with utilities, get a copy of the entire bill to the office by the first Friday of the month. Board meeting will be the second Thursday of each month and information has to be compiled.

Food - -Currently there are several food banks in the area. We have a list in your area. If you are not able to use their service, we offer food vouchers to Sav-A-Lot.

SUPPLIES - -Donations of wigs, bed pads, Ensure, disposable underwear, bras, hats, and toboggans, etc. have been made to provide to patients. Supplies are limited so a call to the office before you visit will allow us to pull what you need.
