17th Annual MCCSN Walk-A-Thon

Friday, September 10, 6:15 p.m., through Saturday noon, September 11

The annual Walk-A-Thon is a vital source of income for MCCSN. Without it, very few patients could be financially aided. Organize a team in your area. One way of covering the donation of \$50 per person to walk is to get a business to sponsor you as a walker. Teams can be named in honor or memory of a loved one or even with the name of the supporting business, church or organization.

T-shirts for walkers to be worn at the Walk-A-Thon, as well as specially marked shirts for survivors, will be available after August 1. The shirts are distributed for each team member when your team registers at the MCCSN office, or after the date they become available if you have already registered.

Memorial and Honorary luminaries can be requested in the name of a loved one who has been affected by cancer for a \$10.00 donation each. These luminaries are placed around the stadium and lit during the Friday night memorial ceremony.
